




UNIVERSITY VALUES – WHAT WE AGREE IS IMPORTANT






FULL-TIME / PART-TIME




DEGREE LEVEL





UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT CLASSIFICATION










CURRENTLY WORKING (Seniors Only)




PARTICIPATED IN CAREER RELATED EMPLOYMENT WHILE ATTENDING UL LAFAYETTE (Seniors Only)













SUMMARY of MAJOR SURVEY FINDINGS

2/3 of students rate overall quality of life: excellent or good

1/3 of students think overall quality of life is improving in Lafayette

Students are working, but few have experience in their chosen field

Students highly rate parks & recreation, entertainment, & arts/culture

Students are connected to campus and community, but barriers exist

Infrastructure supporting quality of life is rated lowest
